- 42% of privately-held U.S. firms are Women-owned businesses<sup>1</sup>
- 13 million women owned businesses in the U.S. generating
   \$1.9 trillion in revenue and employing over 9 million people<sup>1</sup>
- The growth rate in the number of women-owned businesses between 2014-2019 increased by 68%.<sup>1</sup>
- 23% of NAHB Associate members are women<sup>2</sup>
- 9% of NAHB Builder members are women<sup>3</sup>
- More than half of NAHB Professional Women in Building members are builder members<sup>4</sup>

# History of Professional Women in Building

### Building Hope for over 60 Years...

- Chartered in 1955 as NAHB Women's Auxiliary
- 1955 Chartered 24 local PWB councils and over 1,000 members
- In 1955, collecting \$1 from each member began the tradition of the Building Hope Annual Scholarship. To date, the scholarship program extends between \$8k - \$12k annually to students
- 1989 Council renamed to Women's Council
- 2009 Council renamed the Professional Women in Building
- 2014 Fully integrated into the NAHB Federation
- 2015 Becomes NAHB's Fastest growing council
- 2016 NAHB PWB Launches bringing awareness to contributions and activities that promote, enhance and support housing and women in the industry

### ... HBA/BIA Benefits Commonly Asked Questions

### How much will PWB going to cost my HBA/NIA?

Most local PWB councils are self-supporting requiring minimal resources and HBA staff time. It doesn't have to cost anything. In fact, many PWB councils impact their HBA's/BIA's bottom line positively through increased membership, sponsorship, and participation at HBA/BIA events.

### How much staff time do we need to allocate?

Staff time varies between councils depending on what involvement the HBA/ BIA and EO chooses. The main functions needed by PWB involves the processing of applications and membership dues and circulation of correspondence and materials to members.





### HBA/BIA Benefits Commonly Asked Questions

### What benefit does PWB bring to our HBA/ BIA?

PWB forms a supportive arm for the HBA/BIA by creating the opportunity within the HBA/ BIA for women (and men) to "Get Involved". Local PWB councils are typically very active in the HBA/BIA events and committees. PWB contribute to student Scholarships, Advocacy, and Charitable events and so much more including an extension of your staff volunteering in HBA/BIA programs. PWB grows strong leadership, so your HBA/BIA will be more diverse and prosperous.

### What does it cost to be a member of the PWB?

Each HBA/BIA sets their own dues. NAHB PWB requires \$50 annually for each member; many HBA/BIA's increase their local dues for added revenue.

# Four Steps to Starting a PWB Council • Assess the need for a council in your local association.

Obtain a profile of your local home builders association membership or create an informal survey to determine the interest of one or more councils.

Examine the results of your assessment

If you have determined that you have a core group of members interested in working toward council formation, continue to pursue chartering a council.

Identify council officers and founding members of the new council.

The council chair and vice chair are responsible for guiding the council in setting goals and objectives and will be instrumental in accomplishing those goals throughout the year.
